3. PRESENTATION: BALTIMORE CITY BICYCLE COUNT PROGRAM (15 MIN)

Mr. Jon Leishman and Mr. Quinton Batts will present the Baltimore City bicycle count program. Counting the number of people biking in a location provides data to analyze trends in biking, allows assessment of the impact of facility investments, and provides data that can be applied to future bicycle facilities. The City, in collaboration with the community, has identified locations for automated bicycle counters. To date ten counters have been installed on bicycle lanes and four more will be installed on trails in the coming weeks. The program has received grant funding from the Kim Lamphier Bikeways Network Program and the Rails to Trails Conservancy.

4. QUEEN ANNE'S COUNTY PEDESTRIAN AND BICYCLE MASTER PLAN (20 MIN)

Mr. Steve Cohoon will share information on the Queen Anne's County Pedestrian and Bicycle Master Plan. The plan is a strategic initiative aimed at enhancing the pedestrian and bicycle network across the county. By focusing on safety, accessibility, and overall enjoyment, the plan seeks to create a community where residents and visitors can embrace active transportation options seamlessly. The outcomes of this plan will establish a foundation for future projects and funding opportunities dedicated to improving active transportation throughout the county.

5. PRESENTATION: BALTIMORE REGION CRASH DATA DASHBOARD (20 MIN)

Mr. Charles Baber and Ms. Cindy Burch will present the BMC developed Crash Data Dashboard which was a UPWP project. The dashboard allows four views; crash record behavior summary, crash record behavior analysis, crash record map, and non-motorist crashes with American Community Survey data. The dashboard and uses Maryland State Police Crash Data databases from 2018 to 2023.
