
- \$800 million program countrywide to prevent roadway deaths and serious injuries
- Eligible activities
 - Develop a safety action plan
 - Conduct planning/design in support of action plan
 - Conduct demonstrational activities
 - Carry out projects and strategies identified in an Action Plan





TAMPA SYSTEMIC APPLICATIONS FOR EQUITY (T-SAFE)



- \$20 million award
- Triage:
 - Safety projects on HIN
- Preventative Care:
 - Safety improvements near parks, schools, and transit
- Comprehensive Pedestrian Safety and Equity Action Plan (CPSEAP)
- 74% of funding spent on projects in underserved communities



Project Locations




- High Injury Network Safety:
 - Fund systemic safety improvements on City-owned roads
- Safe Routes to Places
 - Fund safe routes to places projects that will provide safe and comfortable access to major destinations including schools, parks, and transit
- Comprehensive Pedestrian
 Safety & Equity Action Plan






Transportation Project Scopes



- Quick-build improvements
- Safety countermeasures
 - Crosswalks
 - Median Islands
 - Sidewalks
 - Bike Lanes
 - Lane narrowing and repurposing
 - Traffic calming

Transportation 2023: RAPID IMPLEMENTATION





Quick Build Program

- Use low cost "semipermanent" materials
- Leverage in-house design and construction capabilities
- Primarily signs, striping, and delineators (no curbwork)
- \$200k-\$500k budget
