Travel demand modeling begins.

April 15 Letters of financial reasonableness due to BMC.

Mid May – June Draft TIP and Conformity Determination available for public

review, including public meetings.

May 26 and June 23 Opportunity for public to comment at BRTB meeting.

Early July Resolution on TIP and Conformity presented to ICG and TC

July 28 Resolution on Final TIP and Conformity presented to BRTB.

TIP Call for Projects: Preparing for a new TIP



- Updates to Project Phases: FHWA has asked us to clarify project phase definitions in the TIP document.
 The definitions are as follows:
 - Project Planning (PP) -> Planning (PL): Initial phase of project development where the need and feasibility of a project is documented and scoping is broad and involves the public
 - Preliminary Engineering (PE) -> Engineering (ENG): Engineering projects include preliminary and final design. Engineering funds involving detailed environmental studies and engineering to obtain an approved NEPA are under preliminary design. Design activities following preliminary design involve the preparation of final construction plans and are under final design.
 - Right-of-way (ROW): Funding to provide the necessary land for the project, or to protect corridors for future projects
 - Construction (CON): This funding includes the cost of building the designed facility
 - Other (OTH): This funding may include permits, inspections, utility costs, or in the case of transit, the purchase of capital equipment



TIP Call for Projects: Preparing for a new TIP



Updates to Project Phases: How does this effect us?

- This should not impact how you program funds in the TIP, as the project definitions largely adhere to how funds have been programmed by phase in the past. Adding project phase definitions is primarily intended to clarify what each project phase involves for project sponsors and the public.
- The primary update is to distinguish planning (initial phases of project development) from engineering (NEPA, preliminary design, final design).
- Read the updated definitions carefully. Call BMC with any questions or clarifications.
