## **DISCUSSION**

Main point of discussion was to share information on COVID19 operations, disruptions and supply chain demands:

- a. Debbie discussed a growing interest in clear masks for lip reading children and teaching with expression. Andrew shared that the counties do have some divisions that work with children that may also be interested in these products.
- b. Chris (MWCOG) said 3M is still guided by FEMA on delivery matters and they continue to receive mixed messages about supply.
- c. Andrew (Anne Arundel) shared that they have a meeting on July 13<sup>th</sup> to discuss PPE inventory levels going forward and wanted to know if anyone else is moving beyond stockpiling emergency supplies of PPE. Megan and Debbie said they are hearing only stockpiling. Schools, in general, have adopted a stock through November and see what happens in the Fall. Money and storage capacity affect these decisions as well.
- d. Brandon (St. Mary's) shared that they were open by appointment only. Summer camps are being provided, both indoor and outdoor. They have no critical shortages and are operating at 50% capacity for administrative personnel. Their PPE inventory take into account a shortage on warehousing space.
- e. Megan (BMC) stated that she is seeing the emergency food operations beginning to move back to healthy choice priorities. She is also interested in contracting for food packaging.

## **Action Items:**

<u>1.</u> Debbie will reach out to schools to collect contracts for food containers used to distribute meals to students.
