deman	point of discussion was to share information on COVID19 operations, disruptions and supply chain nds:
a.	Debbie asked if anyone was being asked to purchase locally to boost local economies. The answer was unanimously No. Also mentioned that PG County was using a consultant to help address the reopening procedures for things, such as custodial, social distancing, fleet operations, etc
b.	Kerrie shared that they have four workgroups to determine reopening; Logistics, Employee Relations; Curriculum & Special Education.
c.	Brynn said that the Fall reopening is undecided. They have been purchasing a lot of technology. Offices are starting to return to work on staggered schedules to reduce the number of employees in the building at any one time.
d.	Dom shared they plan to release their recovery plan on Friday but online learning for the Fall is eminent with the exception of on-site for essential face to face classwork, such as labs.
e.	Rick said that summer school software has been purchased to facilitate online classwork. Chromebooks are being bought to prepare for demands in the Fall. Staff is at 50% for their 4-day summer week schedule. They will alternate teams every two days. Schools are accepting deliveries and the print shop is open.
f.	Angela shared that employees have returned with set alternating days regardless of comfort level. A waiver process will be used to consider extenuating circumstances. There has been no decision for the Fall. She cited that they have served up to 3M meals over COVID and they were able to keep everyone safe.

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
