MARYLAND DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION | STATE HIGHWAY ADMINISTRATION

➤ From MAP-21 and FAST Act:

A State shall develop a risk-based asset management plan that

- *describes how the NHS will be managed to achieve system performance effectiveness and State DOT targets for asset condition,*
- *while managing the risks,*
- *in a financially responsible manner,*
- *at a minimum practicable cost over the life cycle of its assets.*

- The TAMP covers the **National Highway System** for all of Maryland.
- **NHS Partner Owners** should be involved, and partner-owned portions of the NHS are included in TAMP analyses.

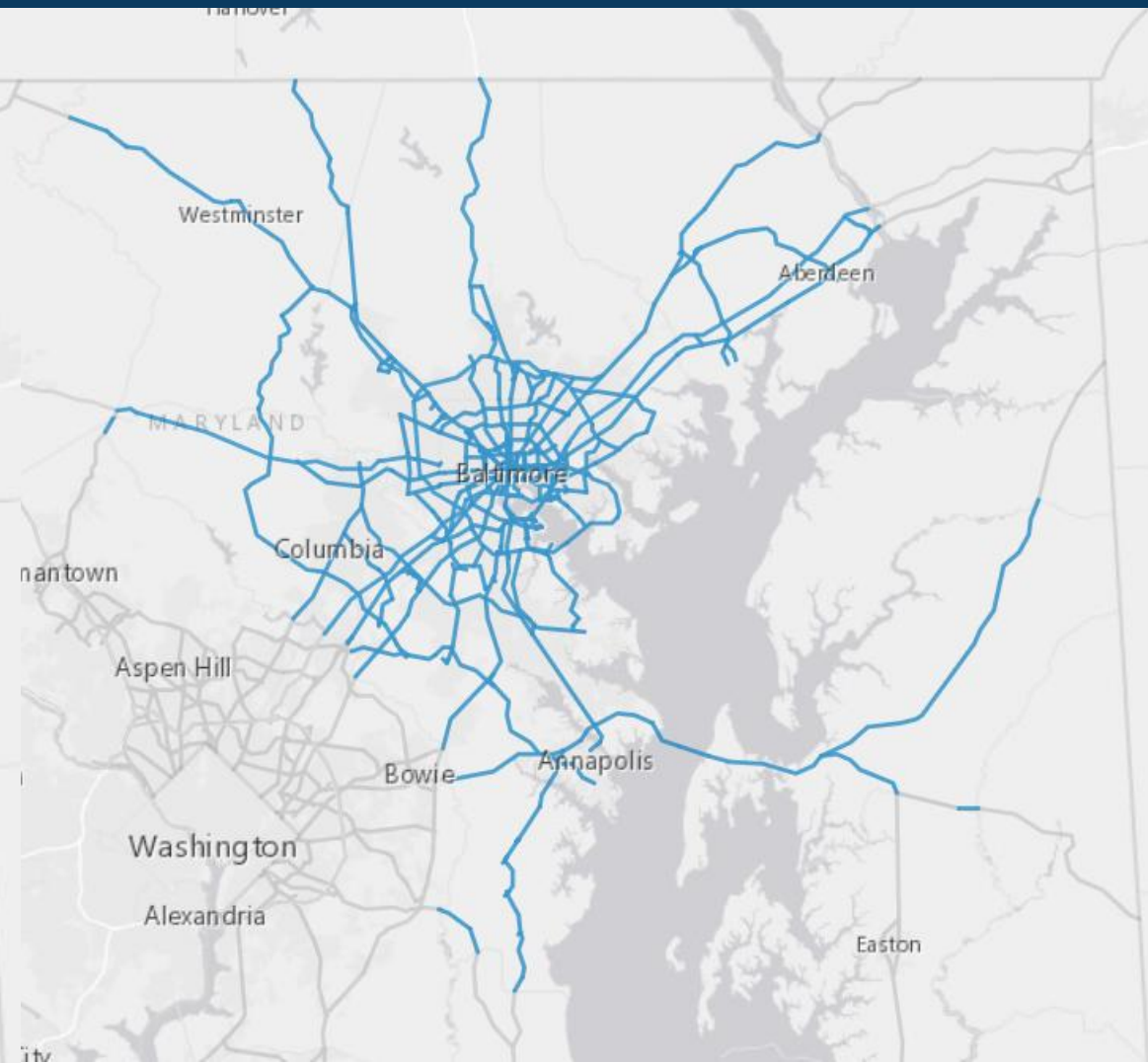
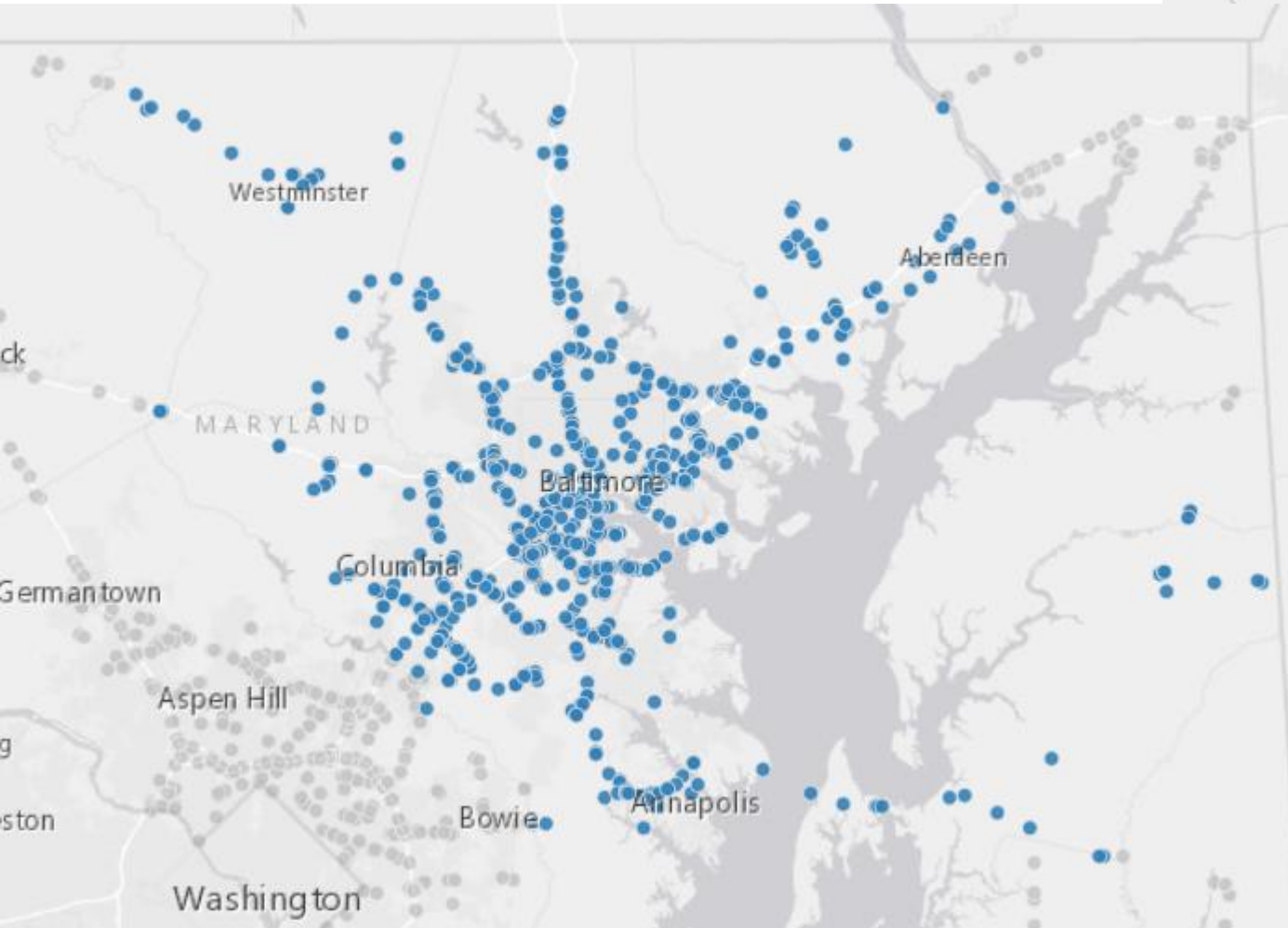

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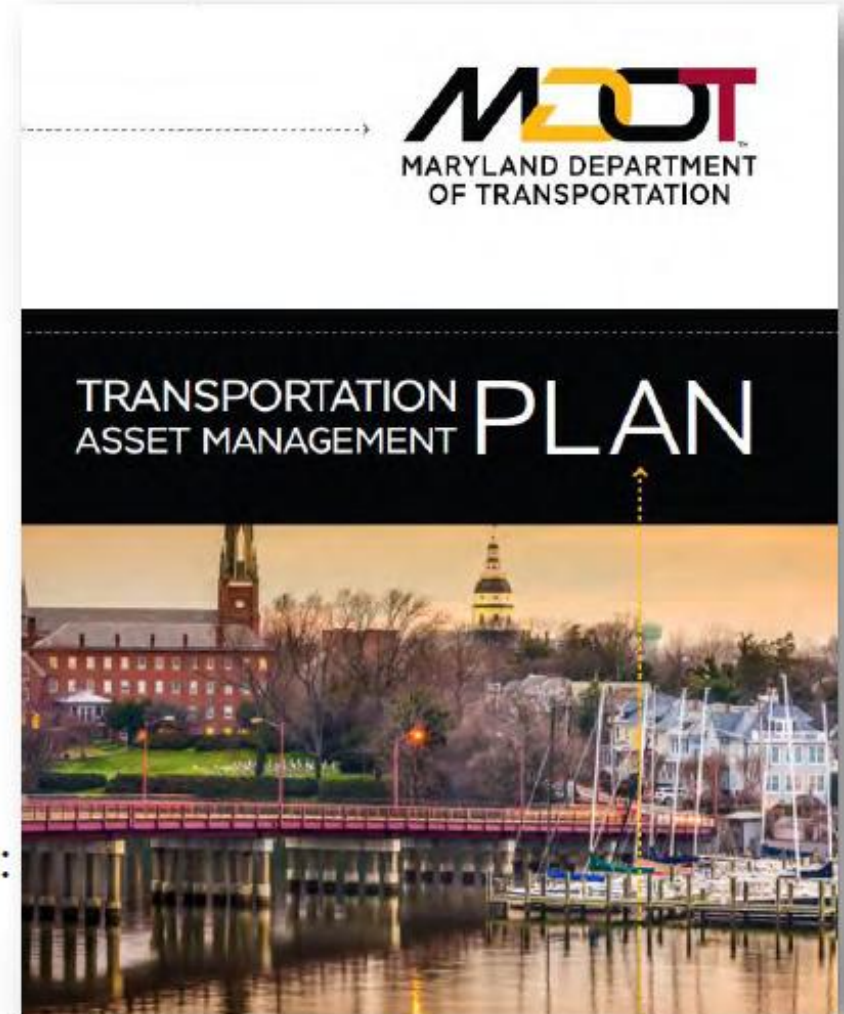

- Asset Inventory
- Current Conditions
- 2-Year, 4-Year, 10-Year Targets
- Life-Cycle Analysis
- Risk Management Plan
- Financial Plan
- Investment Strategies

➤ Annual Consistency Review

- States must demonstrate consistency with TAMP via:
 - Fiscal year investments
 - Annual performance evaluation



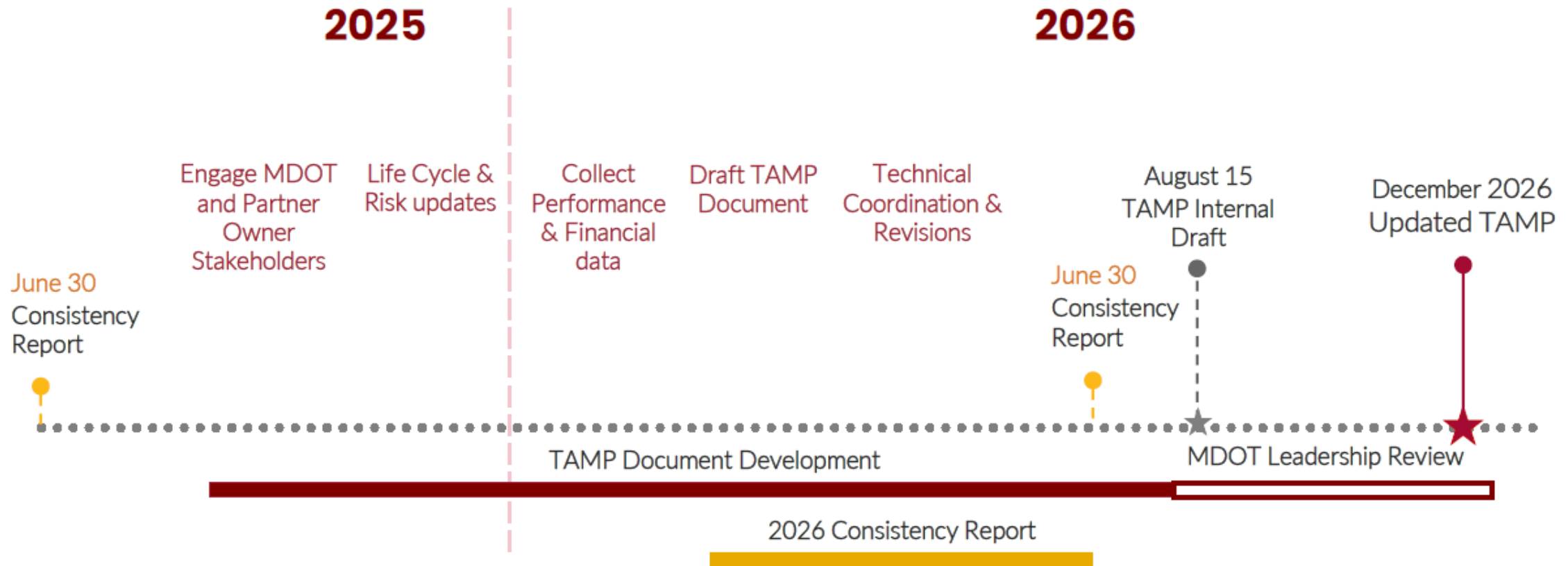
